



Seafood Market Update 11/6/19

SALMON-The situation in Chile is improving but there are still some plants that are not able to process due to the ongoing protest. This is causing major supply issues and driving prices up fast. Canadian prices are stable for fillets but whole fish prices are up. Faroe and Scottish prices are stable this week.

TUNA-Prices have dropped some more for the weekend. We are still sourcing direct from Costa Rica and the quality has been perfect. All beautiful 50-75# Yellowfins.

WORD-Canada and Florida have been loading up the east coast and prices are down again. We have fish from both areas and they are all short trip/overnight fish.

MAHI-The market just hit rock bottom for the weekend. We have brand new 10-20# fish from Panama.

HALIBUT-There were some areas that just closed in Canada and the supply dried up fast. Prices for whole fish jumped almost \$2.00 a pound. We do have Canadian fish available in the 20-50# range. Prices will be much higher next week.

ROCKFISH-After a week of really poor demand we thought prices would drop but they did not. There are a few local fish around but most are in the 2-5# range. Big fish are very expensive right now. We are trying to grab some fish out of Virginia for the weekend but its slim pickings right now.

CRABMEAT-Venezuelan market continues to drop about every 5 minutes!!! Production in North Carolina should really start to slow down after these next cold fronts.

LOBSTERS-Hard shell prices are coming down slowly.

SNAPPER-Not as cheap as last week, but still a great value.

GROUPER-Steady.

WILD SALMON-Still a few wild Cohos trickling in.

BEST BETS-Tuna, Sword, Mako, Wahoo, Monkfish and wild Blue Catfish fillet.
